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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now have we reduced their amount in half at least? Have we reduced...

SENATOR JENSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the amount they receive in half?

SENATOR JENSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well \$2.5 million is less than half of \$7 million. So why haven't we reduced Creighton and those other big shots who do have political muscle and lobbyists? Or have I answered the question in the form that I asked it?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, I'd be glad to expound on that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR JENSEN: The LB 692 program, which set out \$10 million a year for research, biomedical research, that Creighton and the Med Center participate in. We have behavior health, which gets about .well, behavior health, which is really a lot of our ongoing expenses and costs that we're putting into mental health, as well as substance abuse. We're at \$19.1 million. Developmental disabilities, \$5 million; public health, \$8.5 million. And that's public health, but some of that is also minority health. Respite, \$1.06 million. So of the \$50 million, we really haven't changed that since the initial funding of LB 692.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But we're changing this program.

SENATOR JENSEN: This...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It was \$7 million.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, it was \$7 million. And it was the same thing. It was a carve-out. When the dollars came, that's when we wrote the check out. We didn't reduce anything else. We don't really...
