SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bromm, does...?

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator, somebody is going to give a commercial for this insurance company and tell all the services that they provide. I'm not a part of advertising for any company, and they are not holy as far as I'm concerned. But before I get into that, does this company sell automobile insurance?

SPEAKER BROMM: My understanding is no, but I will find out for sure and tell you if it's otherwise.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's good enough. Thank you. Members of the Legislature, you know what I feel like as a member of this Legislature? I feel the way I do when I see black people groveling and crawling and worshipping white people. Good God, the insurance company is coming here. You don't have to beg them now. You don't have to lie. You don't have to grovel. You don't have to thank them like they created you and gave you your children. Why do you have to do that? Do they pay you to give them more in the way of a commercial than they do when they're on television? They are coming here. They said they're coming. I said I wouldn't oppose it. If you all keep carrying on like this, you're going to have a fight from me to get it done. Stand up sometime and have some dignity about yourself.
