SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. How does this compare with the employees kicking in with the state teachers, other plans? Is this, the 11 percent, about what other people contribute, Senator Stuhr? That's more of a curiosity than anything else?

SENATOR STUHR: All right. I don't have those other figures, you know, right before me.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay, I was just...yeah, when I saw that figure, I got...you know, is that "normal" or is it abnormal?

SENATOR STUHR: I think it's actually a little bit higher.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Stuhr, I know we talked about this earlier but I want it on the record. Now this is the employee and the employer are all going to put in one more percent, is that right?

SENATOR STUHR: That's correct.
