SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay, and is this...is there a sunset on that?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, there is. It's a one-year sunset.

SENATOR JANSSEN: A one-year sunset and...

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...then I'm sure that if we're still here we will be back and look at it again next year to see if it's warranted to continue or not.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, that is correct. And as I stated earlier, this deficit has come about primarily because of the downturn in the market.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay, and this is only on the defined benefit plan, is it?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you. Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Janssen and Senator Stuhr. Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. As I understand this proposal, this is something that if this bill would not pass the obligation of the state would be over \$400,000. The way it is it's going to be something over \$200,000. Accordingly, I support it. But I would also like to ask Senator Stuhr a question following up a little bit on what Senator Ray Janssen asked, if I might.
