happened, because of the recession. Look at your bank accounts. Look at your statements. Look at your stocks. They all dropped. They had savings that was drawing maybe 10 percent. They went down 2 percent. They are going to be short. It's that simple. The teachers, the state patrol, these groups said they're going to step up to the plate and I believe them sincerely because I was confronted, not confronted, but called immediately by an official from the teachers group and assured me that they were going to do this, and so appreciate that. They were standing up and going to take responsible measures for their...the actions that they had no control over. I thank them very much for that.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker, Senator Stuhr, I found the answer to the question that I asked you (laughing). And you got it too. Yeah, judges contribute 4.28 percent and that...but the state does more because of the...they use support of the courts. And the school people do 7.25 percent. So just so it's on the record. I asked the question and maybe you have the answer right now too, Senator Stuhr. But do you agree?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, actually we have the school employees at 7.32 with 101 percent match by the employer. The judges have 6 percent. The state employees have 4.33. And so, yes, the State Patrol at 12 percent, now the anticipated 12 percent is much higher. The State Patrol has chosen not to use social security, however, so that is one reason, and it might be good to have that on the record. Thank you.
