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SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Raikes, in the projections that we're looking at for schools and what money will be available for them, does the increase in property valuations that's most certainly going to occur by the end of this year, is that factored in at all in the revenues or the resources that will be available to them or is that an adjustment that's made out there in a year or so that is...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SPEAKER BROMM: ...not reflected in what we're looking at for the shortfalls to these districts as we stand here?

SENATOR RAIKES: Senator, the estimates are incorporated all along. The actuals, of course, are incorporated as soon as it's known what they are. But, yes, in the numbers we're working with in terms of levies required in order to make the budget balance, anticipated increases in valuation are taken into account.

SPEAKER BROMM: If we have the projected increase in valuation along with the availability of \$1.10, what percentage then of the school resources will be borne by property tax? Is that possible to project that? I'm sure it is, but has anyone done that?

SENATOR RAIKES: I haven't and I could see if I could...

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm sorry, Senator, your time is up, Senator Raikes and Senator Bromm.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Hudkins, on the Wehrbein amendment to the committee amendments to LB 1093. Senator Hudkins.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I appreciated these two charts that we were handed out. I really appreciated the one on the average levies, and I love
