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the \$1.05. I don't know whether I can...I don't think I can stomach the \$1.10 that was Senator Wehrbein's amendment. But one of the things I think we have to think about in this body is that school districts are different--that they have different assessed valuation behind each student. And I know the equalization aid is supposed to help kick that in. I'm looking at a chart that the counsel for the Education Committee, if you look at Adams and Antelope County, Elgin Public Schools has \$1 million behind each one of their students. For 1 cent, they can raise a lot of money in comparison to the other and they probably don't get any equalization aid. So I really think I disagree with my colleague, Senator Pederson, is that the buck stops here. I think we have to make the decision rather than pushing it down and saying leaving it up to the local school districts. Why did we put caps on schools and local political subdivision? Because we were facing a petition to do that. So if I keep...I think if we keep raising the levy up again on property tax we're going to be back with a petition. That is why we did it. I was part of the Revenue Committee that did that. So I think that we're going maybe in reverse as far as property tax because that's what you hear from people--we don't want the property taxes too high. And so I will support the \$1.05, the original amendment come out of the Education Committee, and at this time cannot support the \$1.10. And, Senator Schrock, I will give the rest of my time to you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, would you respond.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. I'll be brief. It bothers me a little bit that we have all this money laying around in this state. Look at all the funds that we have. Senator Jensen, I don't know how many health funds you have, but I'll bet you can find dollars all over the place in Tobacco Settlement Fund, but they all have a balance. We have \$300 million in our school lands and funds trust fund. We can't spend it. That bothers me a little bit. We have \$25 million in the LUST Fund, Leaking Underground Storage Tank Fund. All these...we have all these balances, but yet we can't access them. I have a constitutional amendment in the Education Committee that will let us access some of that money, but it would take a vote of the people. But I think maybe it's time we
