SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, offering me like time is giving a person dying of thirst on the desert a drink of cold, clear water. Members of the Legislature, I'm glad to hear Senator Tyson say that not only is he opposed to Senator Wehrbein's amendment, but I think he said the committee amendment and the underlying bill. I will not argue against what Senator Raikes is presenting as the reason for offering the bill itself and the committee amendment. But it just happens to run counter to what I think we ought to do. It runs counter to some extent to what Senator Brashear thinks we ought to do, so I'd like to ask Senator Brashear a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Brashear, to a question?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Brashear, having listened to your comments, I doubt that you're in support of Senator Wehrbein's amendment. Is that true?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That is true. I am not in support of the Wehrbein amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But when it comes to the committee amendment and the underlying bill, you would have a bit of vacillation. Is that true?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That's true because that's where we are today.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If that bill were done away with, it would put pressure on the Legislature to find some other source...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...of revenue to do what this bill is designed to produce. Would you agree with that?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That's correct, it will.
