CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was successful. Debate does cease. Senator Wehrbein, you're recognized to close on your amendment, AM3027 to the committee amendments to LB 1093. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, I'd like to have a call of the house, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There's been a request for a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call vote aye, those opposed nay. Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The house is under call. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Unexcused senators report to the Chamber. The house is under call. The house is under call. Senator Hudkins, Senator Mossey. Senator Wehrbein, as you know, your time is...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Can I go ahead and go, Mr. Speaker?

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: This debate we had this morning, perhaps this afternoon, perhaps tomorrow, is necessary.
