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So I'd ask you to reconsider the vote that you took before because we're putting more burden on our local people but I think it's a...I think it's worthwhile that we come up with a compromise; that we did \$1.05 and this is kind of halfway, so I hope that you will reconsider the vote and pass Senator Chambers' amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Wehrbein, your light is next. Senator Wehrbein waives. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to speak.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I need to ask Senator Raikes a question or two.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Raikes, would you yield to a question or two?

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Raikes, when a dollar and a nickel was decided on, had that gloomy forecast been made?

SENATOR RAIKES: No, it had not, Senator. That's a good point. That was before the forecast board made their last...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Had the \$151 million judgment in the low-level waste been announced?

SENATOR RAIKES: No, that had not either been announced.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So we have two very large factors that were not taken into consideration at the time a dollar and a nickel was decided on by the committee. Is that fair to say?

SENATOR RAIKES: That's true, Senator, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, let me tell you what my situation is around here. I will take a very strong position when I think that position is right, but I do listen and I pay attention to things. And I've also acknowledged that if I see a reason to change a position, I
