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that we want to stay away from that, mortgaging our future. Term limits, we've got...I looked around this place and I still find it unbelievable that six years from now there aren't going to be any senators on this floor then that are here now. It's kind of hard to believe and I don't want to mortgage our future with...it's not that I don't trust the new people that'd be elected, the 49 new senators, but it's going to be tough for me to swallow the...you know, expect them to solve the problems we've dumped in their laps now by mortgaging our future and I won't go that way. So I want to reiterate, we don't have to...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...address this \$1.07 right now. We can put this thing off. We don't have to do it on...we don't have to do it this year, this session. There's so many things in flux right now there with the \$104 million of the Economic Forecasting Board. There was a time, as I understand it, Appropriations Committee was considering just ignoring that. So it's a long ways from a given, that it's not going to change next October when they meet. I hope it does. I hope it's erased. And I hope we've got \$100 million extra revenue we weren't counting on. Growing at 3.9 percent, I'd say there is a fair chance of that. We'll have the hard figures in October. We'll have the next session to work on this, and to me about the only thing we're trying to do is keep superintendents' jobs a little easier projecting state aid. And for what they are getting paid, as I recall, Senator Smith and I was visiting, the new superintendent in Lincoln can certainly earn some of that 200-plus thousand dollars by working on the budget. So I have some sympathy to school boards, with the lack of ability to hang their hat on what their state aid payments may be but we've worked through that before and I'm sure they're capable of...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Time.

SENATOR BAKER: ...working for it again, through it again. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Baker. Senator Beutler, your light is next.
