80 percent. You might get 70 percent. Sometimes you get 55 percent, but you make a decision and you go on to the next part of the solution. And maybe you get a little concession there hopefully that makes it a little more palatable for you, but that's the way it has to be done. And so I'm hopeful that...I'm going to support this reconsideration. I'm going to support the amendment, and that isn't an easy thing for me to do. I don't particularly want to go home and have people saying you voted to raise property taxes. But I think under the circumstances and what's at stake here, and for the sake of some stability and some plan into the future, we've got to do some of these kinds of things. And...it...so I would encourage you to really think hard about it, think about this as a compromise and let's see if we can't get something moved. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Beutler, followed by Senator Schimek. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: (Microphone malfunction.) Call the question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Question has been called, do I see five hands? I do see five hands. The question before the body is, shall debate cease on the motion to reconsider? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. The question before the body is call the question on the motion to reconsider. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was successful. Debate does cease. Senator Wehrbein, you're recognized to close on your motion to reconsider.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, I'd ask for a call of the house.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There's been a request for a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call vote aye, those opposed nay. Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under
