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SENATOR RAIKES: I do, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think such a discussion could occur better if it were the only topic that the Legislature had to address?

SENATOR RAIKES: You mean the only topic between now and the remainder of the session?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I didn't say that.

SENATOR RAIKES: Oh, okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If it were the only topic that the Legislature had to address, could the type of discussion that I characterized earlier better occur if this were the only topic we had to discuss?

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, I...that's certainly a possibility. I'm not...go on, I'm not sure I follow you exactly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, let me put some additional factors into the question. If we had to discuss this issue and five to ten other serious issues, we could not give as much time to this issue as would be the case were this the only issue we were discussing. Would you agree with that?

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes, I would agree with that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So if we did come back for a special session, we could, no matter how peeved we may be at coming back, we, nevertheless, could give more concentrated attention to this matter. Would you agree?

SENATOR RAIKES: It would be concentrated, I would agree.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now...

SENATOR RAIKES: Excuse me if I don't sound excited about a special session, but go ahead.
