SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, it's late in the day for most people other than myself. We're just getting into the territory for me where I'm starting to come alive and really feel my juices flowing. So I will make up for any lack of enthusiasm you show. Senator Raikes, how can we discuss this one bill adequately in the remaining days if there are other bills of larger magnitude and greater import which have not yet been resolved, and they, themselves, might take the rest of the session? That would be a hard thing to do, wouldn't it?

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, it would, Senator, but that's a part of the job here, as you well know better than I, that sometimes you have to make the calls and when you're crowded for whatever reason up against the side, so to speak, you go ahead and make some decisions or the body will make some decisions that maybe would come much more slowly if there were more time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let's say that the remaining time were money instead of time and we want to make a purchase. The purchase...
