take comfort in the prospect of my being weary this evening. I intend to continue discussing this bill and I will discuss it alone. In fact, I really don't mind that because there are some other things that I will touch on that relate to the cost of government as absorbed by municipalities; problems that our citizens would have with expenses were not I alert enough to get legislation on the books that would bail them out when they face catastrophic expenses through no fault of their own but rather the unwise decisions and actions of law enforcement personnel. And I will make clear what it is I'm referring to as I proceed this evening. But to come back to what this bill is purporting to do, there are my rural colleagues who are still cleaving to the position that I had so strongly advocated this morning. I want them to understand that I am not like a person who just gets religion, and we all know how that works. This person will get religion this morning, will want to save everybody by noon, and if that fails, he backslides by 4:00. Things just don't work that way when it comes to trying to get people to shift their position. It is clear that those who opposed the earlier amendment that dealt with 7 cents are still holding to the position that I had earlier. How could I pretend or even suggest that I don't understand their holding to that position when it was my position for so much of the discussion? So I do not fault them. But at some point, they are going to have to face what I came to face sooner than they did. We have a problem that we're either going to solve this session or we're going to come back for a special session. And I am amenable to either of those eventualities, but I will not agree to any increase in the sales tax to try to close that gap. I will not agree to any increase in the gasoline tax to fund or help to fund public transportation in certain parts of the state, wherever that money might be spent. A bill was advanced Friday which does one of those things. So I intend to fight that bill and I will have some amendments on it before it comes up for debate again. My good friend Senator Combs has a bill which is surfacing sooner than I thought it would but I managed to have three amendments ready for that, as they say, that puppy and I'll file them. And there are plenty of other bills. I'll tell you all one bill that I'm not going to mess with. That's LB 888. You know why I'm not going to mess with LB 888,...
