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SENATOR CUDABACK:    One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    ...Senator Stuhr?    Because if you look at LB 888 and you go to the right-hand side of the eight to the top half and you eliminate that downward sweep of that loop, what do you have? Six, six, six. Now you know 666 is right up my alley and it kind of goes along with Senator Stuhr's bill about tattooing because that number is supposed to be tattooed across people's faces or their heads. So, Senator Stuhr, do you see how all these things kind of come together toward the end of the session? Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK:    Thank you, Senator Chambers.    Senator Chambers, there are no...your light is on.    You may continue. It's your third time, as you know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    I understand and I appreciate being reminded, Mr. President, although I was able to keep count this time. This motion, which is to indefinitely postpone the bill, is not going to be successful. I know it. Everybody knows that I'm aware of it. However, there is something that my colleagues may not be aware of. I really want to help solve this fiscal gap that we're facing. I really want to do that. But I do not think my colleagues are as serious about it as I am and, such being the case, I have to use whatever expedients are at my disposal to persuade my colleagues that we all need to come together and solve this problem. The only way that can be achieved in a legislative session, in a legislative setting, is to discuss and discuss and discuss. My tactic in this case is to try to wear down enough of my colleagues to the point where something of value will be done. Maybe whereas 7 cents did not look attractive at all, before we're through 8 cents might look attractive because it's a temporary thing. It is something which can be undone at a later date. But if we don't go to the 8 cents, it will not be because I have not done all that is in my power to bring us to that point. Somebody among the backbenchers had parroted something uttered by a person in the culture corner. The person in the culture corner had said that this discussion that we're having is not about children but, rather, the source of funding. Well, brothers and sisters, if you look only at raising money and see it as an end in itself,
