SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...good word, because it can be used in the first person, the second person, or the third person. Ain't answers all of them. So if education was occurring in the schools, there would be the analysis and evaluation of language and the purpose of it. We would even have pithier discussions on the floor of the Legislature.
