

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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FLOOR DEBATE

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SENATOR HARTNETT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to make them understand what you want them to grasp. So they learned on two tracks--what they learned in school and were not taught, and what I provided them at home. And it shouldn't be necessary for a parent to teach his or her children. People talk too much about the responsibility of parents, but teachers are hired to teach children; schools exist for the purpose of teaching children.
