those who want to get the money cry and say this is what it's worth and it was really a good car. But they didn't have a mechanic work on this very good car. They did the work themselves. I see this as a hustle, and maybe it's not, but I'm not going to support the claim and I'm going to support what Senator Wehrbein is attempting to do this morning. I'm not going to chastise my colleagues, because they heard the testimony. And as the Nebraska Supreme Court says, when they're reviewing a case, the trial judge had the opportunity to observe the witnesses. I'm not concerned or even interested in whether the witness cried or not. I'm interested in the facts of the case. And we don't even know if they retained ownership of the vehicle. They could have sold it. They could have junked it. And nobody has laid eyes on it. It could have been, for all we know, one of these vehicles that when it's going down the road it looks like it's burning number nine coal and the muffler is dragging, the tires are bald, the windshield on the driver's side won't work when you crank it so you have to partly crank until you get a crack between the top of the frame and the window and then push it down, but not all the way down because you're going to have to pull it back up. Who can say that what I'm saying is not true? Nobody. Nobody can vouch...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...for the truth of what we have been told. And if we do pay this claim, contrary to what some might want to say about doing this on a case-by-case basis, this is an act of the Legislature. The Legislature will be adopting as policy the payment of these types of claims, so how are you going to pay one and not pay the other? It is not a wise decision. This is not even a good test case, in my opinion, because we don't have facts justifying the payment of the claim in any case. So I'm supporting Senator Wehrbein's motion. Thank you, Mr. President.
