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coverage and the media we do it a little differently, but that's the point of what I'm doing. I want to call their names to the attention of the public. If they had any self-respect, they would have said, although there might be a question as to whether the treasurer is liable, we want to pay these late filing fees. We are the ones who told the public, trust us and go for our proposed constitutional amendment because the Legislature is not doing its job. Since we have taken that position, it would not look right, there would be something unseemly about our turning around and not paying these late filing fees which, in fact, are due. And there is a question as to whether liability is there, but it is not certain that the liability is not. Do you know what honorable people will do? They will say, even though I may not be mandated to do this, my honor requires me to do it. There are positions we take on the floor that we're not mandated to take, but we take them because it's the right thing to do. And these men are constantly held up as stalwarts of the society, the trinity, the triumvirate, the repository of all that is good, noble, just and pure. Well, I say they are pure shams, they are hoaxers, they are schemers, scammers, and men without honor. Now who else had a big part to play in this amount? You-all's favorite--term limits of America, \$4,996.25; allow me to round that up to \$5,000. You all know what they did. They paid people to get signatures to get a term limits proposition on the ballot, and they succeeded. When I was filing for reelection, I had to go to the Douglas County Election Commissioner's Office and a person was laughing with me about how the former election commissioner, Lautenbaugh, handled this. If there was a signature on the petition, the name would be that of a minor.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it was known that the name was a minor and not eligible to register or to vote, but Lautenbaugh put in place the ruling that they would follow at the Douglas County Election Commissioner's Office, that if there were a male in the household who was old enough and eligible to vote, even if not registered, would make that signature of the juvenile valid, and that's how they counted those signatures on those petitions and got enough, or helped get enough, to put it on the ballot. So
