SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, about 2.5.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I don't think we need to change the amount because what we're not...we're not taking money from anybody; we're not paying money to anybody. We are saying that these amounts are not going to be written off. And Senator Schimek reemphasized what I am underlining--these people have the wherewithal. As for this term limits outfit, and they are still speaking against efforts by members of this Legislature to do something about term limits, but the address they gave in Connecticut or wherever it was did not respond. I will find it before we get through so that if you want to send them some...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...some junk mail. Okay. The entity has no connection to or agent in the state of Nebraska. A lawsuit to collect the late filing fee of this term limits outfit would have been expensive and with questionable prospects for success, and the statute of limitations had run. But they had tried to send several letters to contact this outfit and they got no response of any kind, and I don't think they deserve a free ride by being written off the books. They should be there and people can see just the type of operation they are. Thank you, Mr. President.
