SENATOR SMITH: Senator Chambers, your effort here to hold some folks responsible, where would that money end up?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It will never...no money will ever come. This just means that they will remain on the books as an operation that did not pay their late filing fees. Accountability will not write them off. They're not going to be pursued. My amendment will not make them pay a single nickel. All it does is says that they will not be written off.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay. Assuming that they would pay, then where would those funds wind up?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if they would pay, the money would go wherever late filing fees go.

SENATOR SMITH: Uniquely to other penalties levied against citizens of Nebraska?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I can't say that, Senator, of my direct knowledge, because this is not an area that I get entangled in, because I don't campaign, I don't raise money. So I believe it has its own...when I say "it," I mean the Accountability and Disclosure area of the law, would have its own set of laws that deal with whatever they do and where fines, penalties and so forth will go. But I cannot answer that question of my own knowledge.

SENATOR SMITH: So those wouldn't end up with the school fund, like most penalties in Nebraska?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if I knew that, I'd know the answer to the question. But I just, really, I just don't know.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Thank you, Mr. President.
