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person were in this situation or connected with an organization or a committee that had done something like this, that person would be prohibited from participating in anything until the payments were made. But I'm not aware of anything currently existing that would say that.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Okay. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Well, I, myself, believe that people that don't pay these filing fees and that sort of thing, I don't think they should go scot-free. I think there should be some type of a penalty along the line some place, so I believe I can certainly support Senator Chambers' amendment. Thank you, and I'll turn the rest of my time back to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Louden. Senator Chambers, there are no further lights on. You're recognized to close on AM3276.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to add to what Senator Louden said. He said these people should not go scot-free. I will say they should not go Walter Scott free. And I hope you will vote for this amendment and, to make it clear, nobody is going to be pursued, those who are on this side of the grave and those who are on the other side. It simply serves as a memorial of those people who did not pay what the system says they should pay and, yet, the ones with the lion's share of the responsibility are very capable of paying. They still are around now and this term limits outfit is still doing mischief. Mr. President, I will take a machine vote before I ask for a call of the house.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the closing on AM3276, offered by Senator Chambers. The question before the body is whether that amendment should be adopted. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on adoption of the Chambers amendment to LB 1241. Have you all voted on the Chambers amendment who care to, adoption of AM3276? Record please, Mr. Clerk.
