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Upon such notification, the division, with approval of a majority of the members of the Executive Board of the Legislative Council, may provide for the transfer of all remaining patients at such center to appropriate community-based services or other regional center services pursuant to this section and cease operation of the regional center. So as we downsize and you get to a point where only 20 percent of the capacity is still at the regional center, there will be a notice given. And upon that notice by the division to the Legislature and, of course, Health and Human Services are continually involved in this, and the oversight commission are involved in this, that that notice will come and then the Exec Board will be notified for approval. I think this makes sense. Certainly there comes a point in time, if we had a regional center that we had six, seven, eight people and still maintaining a staff, maintaining buildings, and it...at a point in time we need to recognize that we're low enough that, yes, we should be looking at closing of the operation. Now, I also want to mention that in Hastings there is a substance abuse program out there for youths. These are kids from the YRTC, from York, that have a drug or alcohol problem that are to be serviced there. They're going to continue. Certainly the ACT teams that are out at Hastings, doing a wonderful job, not only do I hope that continues, I hope it's even expanded, and then also outpatient treatment. In Norfolk, outpatient treatment will still go on. Other treatments will still go on. We have...it's amazing to me how things are beginning to transition already. I was particularly pleased when, just last week, Lancaster County now has a one-call, in that anybody who...any police officer who picks up somebody who is in an emergency situation, by making one phone call, will be referred to the appropriate setting for that individual, so they're not driving to this facility and that facility, trying to find a place for them. I hope that we can have that in every part of the state, that we can have a one-call service, and I think that we will. Lancaster is just the first one to do that and recognize that. We are beginning to receive reports from the regions, and they are to have those reports by the end of this month. I've had the opportunity to view the one from Region I in Scottsbluff. I had the opportunity to look at a rough draft from Region VI, the other part of the state, in the eastern part of the state. I'm
