And so that is very, very gratifying. I look forward to a system that will be a system where we have a variety of services, we have a full array of services, that every person can be served that needs service, that we can have a mental health system that we're proud of. With that, again I just give my thanks to all those who have worked on this issue. I also want to mention Speaker Bromm, Senator Landis, who were brought into the negotiations, but I think that we have something that we can all be proud of. With that, I just hope that the body will see fit to begin this process and, through the passage of LB 1083. With that, I'll close my remarks on AM3329. Thank you, Mr. President.
