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Behavioral Health Oversight Commission will give its opinion on the proposed reduction or continuation of...or discontinuation to the Governor and the HHS Committee and the Legislature. And if they believe that there is not enough done, you know, I think that they will recommend that they won't close. Under Section 10(2)(c) of the amendment--no further commitments or admissions or readmissions for such services are required due to the availability of community-based services or other regional center services to replace for such services--you know, with that part I see that, as we close down regional center sections in Norfolk and move those into facilities in Omaha or someplace else, that the waiting list is there right now that we still could put people in facilities that are up and running, and that as we talked about this in negotiations, that this wouldn't preclude...this section would not preclude readmission or admissions to...if there is a need. Senator Jensen mentioned that we want to make sure that if there's a need there that...and a way to fill those, whether it's in Norfolk or Hastings, as we transition out, we still fill that need. And I appreciated Senator Jensen saying that this morning when we talked about it. Also under Section 10, subsection (2) of the amendment, we talked about the division may reduce regional center services and...where they'd replace them where they are available. And, you know, my reading on that would be that where they're currently available, not where they might be available in the future. And the direction that I would read from this is that it would mean that they're up and going before you reduce. And that's the discussion that we've had since the beginning, but I think that I want to reassure people who are giving these services currently in facilities like Hastings and Norfolk, that that's my intent and I think that's the intent of the committee and this amendment. With that, I would like to ask a question to Senator Engel, one of the...if he would respond.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Engel, would you respond?

SENATOR ENGEL: Yes.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you, Senator Engel. With the amendment, we ask the Executive Board to look at this one more
