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SENATOR MINES: Okay. And if I look at the amendment with a critical eye, specifically paren (6), where it says the "occupancy of any regional center reaches 20 percent or less of its licensed capacity," I'm completely out of my element but even I could manipulate a facility to have at least 20 percent occupancy. There is no incentive for a facility, whether it's Hastings, Norfolk, or wherever it is, to reduce occupancy. Is that fair, do you think?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, that could happen. However, there's oversight on each one of those regions right now. And they...Hastings has been downsizing for, oh, better than a year,...

SENATOR MINES: Uh-huh.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...as a matter of fact, a couple of years back, and moving people into community-based services already.

SENATOR MINES: But the occupancy, would it be both inpatient and outpatient services?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, we're talking about here in...

SENATOR MINES: Strictly inpatient.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR MINES: Okay. Well, again, Senator Jensen, thank you. And just because of you, I'm going to support the amendment, and I appreciate your speaking with me. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Mines. Senator Schimek, on AM3329.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. I stand in support of the amendment and to tell Senator Jensen that I will be supporting the bill. That doesn't mean I think that this is perfect. (Laugh) And that doesn't mean I am not worried. I have probably paid more attention to this issue than just about any other one that we've dealt with this year. And
