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I'm still reading reports about what's happened in other states. And I'm very nervous about it, as I'm sure you are, probably. You are the prime architect and you will be the one that will be responsible, in some respects. I think this is a very, very important thing that you're doing and that we're doing this year, and I've been wanting to support it all along if I possibly could. I'm worried that somewhere down the line, like in Kansas, the appropriations are going to dry up. The hospitals will close their units, the programs will go away. That's what worries me the most. But I know that there's a lot of enthusiasm out there in the lobby. A lot of the people who are advocates for all of the different groups are very enthusiastic, they're very positive, and they say they're going to hold our feet to the fire, and I think they really mean it. And that's...sometimes you just have to take things and support them with great hope, and that's what I'm going to do. Now, to be more particular and precise, I would like to follow up on Senator Connealy's conversation with you about the Exec Board approval. And, incidentally, I would rather have had it be the Legislature to approve; the Exec Board to approve if the Legislature is not in session, but I'm not going to quibble about it. I just wonder if there will be a hearing, as he suggested. And, you know, when we do resolutions, and I'm assuming this would be kind of a resolution that the Exec Board would sign off on, when we do resolutions that have any meat to them at all, we generally have a hearing. And could you talk about your thoughts about that a little bit more? I wasn't...I was sort of distracted when you were talking with Senator Connealy.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, thank you. The Exec Board, of course, is empowered to make decisions for the Legislature when we're not in session.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR JENSEN: And so they will continue to do that. I don't believe there's anything that's going to happen that you and I are not going to know about. And as I said, if this bill is
