centers were set up, and so the discussion wasn't about where to go; it was how to get there. And so I'm grateful to all those who entered in on the discussion to try to arrive at something that was workable, and still provide good care and make sure that people were taken care of. I would like to ask Senator Jensen some questions, if he would respond.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, would you respond to a question of Senator Burling?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BURLING: Senator Jensen, in subsection (10)...or Section 10, subsection (6), we talk about licensed capacity. Would you be amenable to amending that now or before Select File to say acute licensed capacity? Or do you want to look at that?

SENATOR JENSEN: Senator, I'd like to look at that. I'd certainly be glad to work with you between now and Select File to look at that. When we drafted the amendment, certainly we were looking at licensed capacity. I don't believe that that licensed capacity spells out whether it's acute or secure or intermediate, but I'd be glad to look at that with you.

SENATOR BURLING: Okay, thank you. There are different levels of licensed capacities, different levels of licenses, and so it's a little confusing, I think, to just say licensed capacity. So I appreciate your being willing to work with me on that one. As we come to the Executive Board of the Legislature making the final decision on the closure, do you anticipate that patients will not be moved out of the regional center totally before Executive Board approval? Is that your intent?

SENATOR JENSEN: Entirely? No, I don't think they would be moved out entirely. There will be a gradual reduction, but that's the reason for the 20 percent in there, to, I think, to raise that flag and say, hey, we're getting pretty close. But like I said, it's a gradual measured reduction as we go through this process, and I think that's exactly what will occur.

SENATOR BURLING: Okay. Thank you. Maybe you're not the one to
