Byars. So, thank you again.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I just rise to tell you that I will support this legislation. I think it's the right thing to do. I know there is, from what I understand, there's been a compromise arrived at and that's what we've been waiting for and it's here. I think it's time to move on. So I just wanted to let you know that I will support this amendment. thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Synowiecki.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, members. I continue with my strong support for the underlying bill, LB 1083. I do have reluctant support for the amendment, AM3329. I'm just mindful of the potential manipulations that might go on and potential politics that might enter into some of these decisions, but trust Senator Jensen on this one. I think I echo all the other colleagues that have spoken with regard to the hard work that has been put into this compromise and I appreciate it very much. I'm very much looking forward to proceeding with LB 1083. Just, though, to address some of the concerns that have been put on the table by Senator Janssen, particularly with regard to the emergency protective custody, law enforcement, deputy sheriffs throughout our states, with these horror stories of individuals going through chronic stages of mental health and nowhere to...nowhere for them to receive appropriate help, that is precisely a problem and it's a problem with our current system of mental health service delivery within our current system. LB 1083 attempts to address this. We're...LB 1083 is a community-based approach. It includes provisions for emergency protective custody to answer some of these driving problems in our state that are...that are, I'm very mindful of, particularly in Sarpy County, for some reason there's a particular problem with regard to finding places to take these individuals that are going through an episode of mental health (sic).
