It's all what is appropriate, what Region III determines. As we have community-based services, we're going to have some of those services that will be able to handle acute and secure facilities...or admissions that may replace what you've currently been doing at the regional center. We'll continue, and it's certainly my desire to continue, to work with Hastings to develop that, but Region III is really going to be the one who will determine, I think, the services that will come into region...or, excuse me, into Hastings in the future. I'd sure be glad to be part of that and work on that.

SENATOR BURLING: Okay, thank you, Senator Jensen. That's all I'd have for you now. Just a couple comments before I close. What I've been concerned about in this whole process up to now is that we were maybe moving too fast, like some of the other states apparently did, and they moved too fast and got into trouble. I think that this amendment provides a procedure whereby it has enough checks and balances in it that it will assure a proper speed, proper timing, and so I'm supporting the amendment. And for the record, before I sit down, there was a sheet handed out here, last week I think it was, of the supporters of LB 1083, and Mary Lanning Memorial Hospital was listed on that as a supporter of LB 1083 at that time. The Mary Lanning Hospital had never been a supporter of LB 1083 and were not, as of last week anymore, yet. And so it might have been a human error. I don't know how their name got on there, but I just wanted, for the record, to acknowledge that they're not a part of that, should not have been a part of that list, according to the information I've gotten from them. So those things happen. And thank you much. I return...
