directive over all of those.      I would ask for its passage, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BROMM:      Thank you, Senator Jensen.      (Visitors introduced.)      Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR:      Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body.      I do have a question for Senator Jensen in regards to the State Behavioral Health Council.

SPEAKER BROMM:      Senator Jensen, would you yield, please?

SENATOR JENSEN:      Yes, I will.      Thank you.

SENATOR STUHR:      I was looking over that and it says that there will now be 30 members on that council, and please correct me if I'm not right, that there will be 10 members from the State Advisory Committee for Mental Health, 10 members from that State Advisory Committee for Substance Abuse Services, and 10 members from the State Advisory Committee for Problem Gambling and Addiction Services.      Is that correct?

SENATOR JENSEN:      Thank you, Senator Stuhr.      There currently are 57 members.      This reduces the total down to 47.      The council itself would consist then of 10 members from each of the three advisory committees, 10 members from each of the three advisory committees.      So we are reducing the number somewhat.      The councils still remain...or I mean, there's one council; there are the three advisory committees.

SENATOR STUHR:      Yes, I believe that is correct.      I don't have a lot of problem with selecting 10 members from the State Advisory Committee for Mental Health Services.      But according to the amendment, it appears that there will be 12 members on each of the State Advisory Committee for Substance Abuse, 12 members from the State Advisory Committee for Problem Gambling, 12 members from each of those, and then you're going to take 10 of those 12 and put those on the council?      Is that...

SENATOR JENSEN:      Yes.      There will be equal representation from each council on...or from each...
