SENATOR REDFIELD: Senator, the current documentary stamp tax is \$1.25, and it would be my intent to introduce next year an increase of 50 cents that would go into this fund.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Senator Redfield, and again, thank you for bringing this. As Senator Jensen spoke, this is a critical piece. This is a critical piece to mental health reform, and I'm glad that it is being addressed through this amendment. Thank you, Senator Cudaback.

I just do have a few questions, though. In, I think it was, 2001, Senator Byars introduced a bill and it was LB 549, and that bill created the Homeless Shelter Assistance Trust Fund. And when I was reading through the transcripts on that bill, he made a pretty good argument, Senator Byars did, that the Department of Economic Development administered...at the time they administered the Affordable Housing Trust, and he seemed to think, and he advocated in his bill, by creating a Homeless Shelter Assistance Fund that...and then putting that under HHS, it would be more responsive to those types of needs. And so my question is, is that, the Affordable Housing Trust, which is something I've had an interest in, is under Department of Economic Development, whereas the Homeless Shelter Assistance Fund is under HHS.
