the liquor licenses now. Is that true?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, it does, Senator. There are some new licenses that have been put in later than 1935, but the Class Cs and some of the other ones that were the most common license have not been changed since 1935, along with the wholesaler licenses.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Now, I didn't read the bill completely all over and everything, but does this restructure anything where these liquor establishments can't...they have to pay their liquor bill every month when they buy from the retailer. Has that changed any of that?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Absolutely, that stays the same.

SENATOR LOUDEN: That stays the same, okay. And on these class of liquor license, is there any...I mean where there's the beer only and then alcoholic liquor, that would be where they could sell any kind of alcohol that they so desired?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes. None of that changes, Senator.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Yeah. Now what kind of a license do these beer gardens get that's involved here?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That is usually a special license.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yeah, that's a special designated license they call that, an SDL.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Okay. And is that included in this group of licensing?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No. It stays the same.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Then the fees would probably stay the same for that...
