SENATOR JANSSEN:    Yes, yes.

SENATOR LOUDEN:    ...if it isn't included in here.    Okay, thank you, Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN:    Yes.

SENATOR LOUDEN:    I thought on some of these I have to be ever concerned about some of our heritage days type celebrations and that thing...that sort of thing that goes on in the summer so that we're not setting about to charging them more fees inadvertently and causing a little bit more hardship, because usually those are money-raising events for some of the local organizations.    So that's...thank you, Senator Janssen, for answering my question.    I'll turn my time back to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK:    Thank you, Senator Louden.    Senator Tyson, General Affairs Committee amendments.

SENATOR TYSON:    If Senator...thank you, Mr. President, members of the body.    If Senator Janssen would yield to a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK:    Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN:    Yes.

SENATOR TYSON:    Senator Janssen, I look at the fiscal note and it gives expenditures from the General Fund of \$118,720, but we're going to get revenue of \$6,075.    Well, no, actually a total of \$16,325.    So it's going to take seven years to equal the expenditure from the General Fund.    Is that good business?

SENATOR CUDABACK:    Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN:    Well, Senator, you know we always have trouble with fiscal notes, understanding how they work.    But at least this one will pay something back.    A lot of fiscal notes never do pay anything back, but there is a chance to regroup on this one.    It may take a while.
