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into the...when are liquor licenses up? Isn't there a date certain, year in and year out?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, there is a date certain on them. Right off the top of my head I don't know when that is, but there is...May 1. Okay, most of them are May 1; Class Cs are October 1.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: And if an applicant for a liquor license files in April, one month before the renewal date, they pay that entire 12-month fee, is that correct?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's right, Senator Synowiecki. If I was that person, I'd wait another month before I bought it.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Well, perhaps on Select File, would you at all be interested in entering into a dialogue, as a reflection of the fiscal note on the impact on locals with the bill, about at least looking at the possibility of prorating them, liquor license applications, in terms of what it would cost the applicants?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I would be willing to discuss that with you, Senator.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Senator. Thank you, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Synowiecki. There are no further lights on. Senator Janssen, to close on the committee amendments.

SENATOR JANSSEN: We have an amendment to the committee amendments I believe...

SENATOR CUDABACK: That's to the bill, Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is to the bill.
