SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...my time to Senator Smith.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Senator Beutler, I think I would ask the same question. I was rather surprised, perhaps pleased, but I would imagine, given the fact that it came out of committee unanimously with reasonable amendments, perhaps that was an enticing point to the bill to get it behind us. I'm speculating on that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, you're a lucky boy, Senator Smith. Thank you. (Laughter)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Further discussion, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, members, Senator Smith, I don't have any problem with your bill but I'm a little puzzled also as to what...how this came about? Why...what's the reason for the bill if we really don't make many changes? Just in a nutshell, you may have my time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Certainly, thank you, Senator Wehrbein. I'll speak for the event in my own district. Oregon Trail Days has an evening from 5:00 to 9:00 p.m. They call it the International Food Fair, and some vendors are what we would call permanent vendors. They have a trailer. They're sophisticated. They have everything right there. They pay over \$100 to do so but they can spread that out over several events. Another reality is that nonprofits and churches are already exempt because of their status. Now they're exempt from the fee, not the standards. And so here was a reality that there is a mom and pop setting up for one event, effectively, and it seemed a little unreasonable to assume that they were the same type of operation as an operation in perpetuity that can absorb those
