fees. I believe that it's good for events around the state to bring some variety in and quantity so that events can be successful. There have been several people who have said if we have to pay over \$100 for the permit, they're not interested, and there were several losers in that situation.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Are you...are you through, Senator Smith and Senator Wehrbein? Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members of the Legislature. Senator Smith, would you answer a few questions, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Now this is...I'm looking at the committee amendments. It would be for a single event food vendor shall mean a temporary food establishment that operates at no more than one event per year, calendar year, for a period of no more than two days. Is that right? So that is the way it would be now.

SENATOR SMITH: That is correct.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I'm thinking about, oh, a county fair, and usually most of the county fairs last...most of them last three days. Senator Stuthman could probably help with that. I believe I'm right. So they would not be able to get one of these if it was for three days, then.

SENATOR SMITH: The current language does limit that at two days. I'm flexible. I know that the parties involved from various perspectives have kind of agreed to this. Changing it, I would maybe suggest that on Select File for the purposes of being able to get some feedback.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Did you have...did you...the county officials have anything, have you had any conversation with them? I don't know whether they would handle county fairs. I'm sure they
