SENATOR MOSSEY: Is he punished more than her?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Huh?

SENATOR MOSSEY: Who's punished more than who?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The john, the man who purchases the services of a prostitute. Forget the prostitute in the middle.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Which is punished more severely, the pimp or the man who purchases the services of the prostitute, or is there no difference?

SENATOR MOSSEY: It could be either/or. And, honestly, it's harder to prosecute a pimp than it is a john.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What I'm going to say, Senator Mossey, is that at this point I will not do anything to impede the movement of this bill, but I have to give some more consideration to whether or not that registration should occur. And that's all I will ask you. Thank you.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members, I'm not sympathetic to people who abuse children, who assault children, who produce child pornography, because the producer of the pornography is exploiting these children.
