person continues to farm it, you're not going to allow that valuation to sort of force the change in use by high taxes. And I would just suggest that this is not...I mean, if that's sort of the intent of greenbelting, then you'll have to explain to me why this is really consistent with that intent. It seems like a different sort of objective. And I'll yield you some time if you want to respond to that.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, the...part of the object, I thought, was this. I mean, first of all, there's the whole area of donation and intent and the value of that, how much you value and want to encourage donations, whether it's to the county or city or school district. And that is a big difference, in my mind. And the aspect of recapture, as I understood it, was to prevent somebody from holding land at a lower value than it actually is worth, and then benefitting...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. I'm sorry. Time is up, Senator Raikes. Senator Louden.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. Senator Beutler, I got here somewhat late. But I would like to ask Senator Beutler some questions, if he would yield.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, would you respond?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Yeah, Senator. Am I under the impression that most...your amendment is mostly what's underlined, that changes what's already in the statutes? Is that true?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, the only change in the amendment is on page 2, lines 20 to 25.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah.
