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been indicted. They have been found criminal, but because they have power, their operation continues to go. You can rearrange the letters A-D-M and you can either come up with M-A-D, which is mad, and I would say mad in the sense of insane when the Legislature is following them, or you could say mad in the sense of angry, irate, furious to describe the way I feel about the whole approach toward ethanol. Or you can rearrange the letters and come up with D-A-M, which is the very sedate acceptable way to come across with the word "dam." So if you took the D-A-M and the M-A-D and put them together, it would tell you how mad somebody such as I am about this whole approach. I don't care what the Attorney General or anybody else says. If I see a bill that's going to try to open the door for more plundering by these speculators, purveyors and investors being done through their stooges, water carriers on the floor of the Legislature, I shall fight them. If they try to raise the gasoline tax to pour money into that boondoggle, I shall fight it. Senator Bourne would like to see the locals have a shot at some things. My feeling is that a domestic...or meaning local, bank robber is no better and entitled to no more consideration than a foreign or out-of-state bank robber. A pirate is a pirate is a pirate. And I want young Senator Bourne to know that when that pirate ship strikes whatever false colors it's flying and runs up the Jolly Roger, which is the skull and crossbones, that flag signifies no nation, no country, loyalty, fealty to nobody. These are stateless individuals and everything on the high seas with anything of value aboard is a target. That's the way the "ethanolers" look at things. Any place they see an opportunity to weasel in and plunder, they will do it. So the "watchpersons" must be alert and follow that stage direction that Senator Landis gave us. The door imperceptibly ajar? I shall follow those stage directions...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...when it comes to ethanol. But what I would like, if we could analogize the "ethanoler" to a being of some kind that has a neck and inside that neck is a trachea through which air passes that is essential to maintaining life, I would like to catch that neck in the door when I slam it. Then maybe we'd be through with it once and for all. And at
