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bills have moved in the last few days without a word from me. But believe me, I've been watching, I've been calculating, and I have a pretty good idea in my mind of the bills that are available for my purposes. Twelve days is not a long time. I think we've spent more than enough time on Senator Cunningham's bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you all hadn't voted cloture last time, this thing wouldn't be before us here on Select File. But if I'm going to be the blockage, we'll see who's going to be Mr. or Ms. Ex-Lax who can get things moving. I'm willing to wait and see. And I want to hear more of this discussion between Senator Bourne and Senator Louden about Senator Louden crawling under the wagon. I need to have some more understanding of that, because people are reacting in such a way that there's got to be more to it than what has been said thus far. I'd like to ask Senator Louden a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Louden, would you yield?

SENATOR LOUDEN: Yes, I would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Louden, the whole story hasn't been told about crawling under the wagon yet, has it?

SENATOR LOUDEN: Why, right now I really don't know what they're talking about, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Louden. Thank you. When somebody...
