SENATOR BOURNE: ...a long period of time to go without any money coming into the house.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Beutler. And this will be your third time, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, I passed around another chart for you. It's called, Summary UI Data. I circled the column that says, net benefits paid, which shows you from 1985 to 2004 the total amount in benefits paid out to the...from the fund in those years. And as you can see, the amount paid out in the last four years has been way higher than amounts paid out during the good years, and in the very best years in the 1990s. And of course, that's what is expected. We're in a recession, pressure all around on jobs. But Senator Cunningham keeps talking about bad faith and lack of good cause and all of that. But this...these figures, which demonstrate many, many more people needing the benefits, those aren't additional people who are acting in bad faith. Those are people that are just having a lot of problems finding work. And the only thing we can think to do is make it worse. Senator Loudon, when I was out in the Panhandle, I remember I learned an expression, something about coyote ugly. I don't know if you ever heard that one. I kind of forgot what it means. Can you refresh my memory on that? Well, maybe later. Anyway, this bill is coyote ugly. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers. And this will be your third time also, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the "Countess," meaning "Countess Vickie," already admired my hourglass.
