at Senator Brown's amendment, it amends Article III, Section 24, so I think we've satisfied that hurdle. And then our rules talk about...then it goes into a negative. A nongermane amendment includes one that relates to a substantially different subject. That provides guidance. There is no way, I believe, that one could argue that Senator Brown's amendment is an amendment that relates to a substantially different subject and, again, I, smooth lawyer talk, Senator Louden, I think the key word here is "substantially." I think it's very clear that Senator Brown's amendment substantially relates to LR 209CA. So with all respect to the Speaker, I'm going to vote green and support Senator Brown's motion to overrule the Chair notwithstanding Senator Smith's outstanding process argument. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Louden.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. I rise to overrule on the Chair for the germaneness of this resolution. I also have one, as Senator Landis says, coming up. Senator Landis mentioned that I submarined his State Fair. No, I'm not submarining his State Fair. I'm just adding on something that I think needs to be added on. And as far as the germane, we're talking about the lottery. We're talking about what gambling there is in the Constitution of Nebraska, And also the other legislative resolutions on gambling are all in this same amend...in the same article and same section. So I think it's all in the same area. If we're going to discuss how we're going to spend the lottery money or we're going to spend the gambling money, then we can certainly use it as the same vehicle to decide whether we want to expand the lottery, or expand the gambling, expand the bingo, or whatever is written into this LR 209. It's mostly, the resolution is how the money was going to be spent from some of the proceeds of the gambling, so it would be quite all right to amend this if it was necessary if Senator Brown's amendment is on there to how you're going to spend the money for that type of gambling. So I very well think that this is germane to the subject and I would vote in favor to overrule the Chair. Thank you.
