SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Senator Landis. At least you're truthful. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Louden. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Landis gets touchy when you ask him questions, but I'm going to ask him some anyway, because he put the amendment to us. Senator Landis, I'm looking at your amendment that's before us now. And in line 5, we talk about the amount of money that shall be transferred to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund. Then we continue, for use as provided in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act. That would mean that the Legislature could put into that act anything it chose to.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: But it couldn't spend the money for any purpose it chose to.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But it's to be used as provided in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act.

SENATOR LANDIS: But that's not the only restriction, Senator Chambers. Keep reading.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then we continue,...

SENATOR LANDIS: That's right. There we go.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and shall be used only for the conservation, which is an undefined term; enhancement, which is not defined; and restoration of the natural, physical, and biological environment. What, in your mind, since you crafted this, is the difference between natural and physical as relates to environment?

SENATOR LANDIS: As a matter of fact, that's a recitation of the language that's now in our Nebraska Environmental Trust Act. You could have a...I'll spend a moment, off the top of my head,
