doing that. The natural could be, for example, a river; physical could be a man-created forest; biological could be an animal herd or preservation habitat. And...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But "bi" would mean flora and fauna, the plant and the animal. But here's the point. And I won't...

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...engage you further, because my time will run out. Members of the Legislature, what I'm trying to get you to see is that there are words that are not defined. If you ask Senator Landis his opinion, he could give you an argument as to what he thinks the words mean. But they are not giving us any direction here, so they might be defined in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act if the Legislature chose to do that. But what you can do is open the way for a tremendous amount of litigation on each one of these words. Any money that this Environmental Trust Fund would expend funds for could result in litigation, because a series of words is presented, not one of which is defined. And as for the comment that Senator Landis made earlier, where the constitution mentioned in a broad statement that the education shall be provided for the youngsters--and I'm paraphrasing--that's entirely different and has no bearing whatsoever on what we're talking about here. We're talking about a specific source of money, a specific place where that money is to be transferred, and a specific use for it, and what he cited to you has nothing absolutely to do with what we're talking about. And as a lawyer, I would never have made the argument. But I'm not Senator Landis. That is one to draw a red herring across the trail. If he thinks it's not, then why doesn't he craft this amendment in exactly that same language? Don't talk about the Environmental Trust Fund, just say, this amount of money shall go for these purposes with reference to the environment. Don't even talk about the Environmental Trust Act, or the trust fund. This is a political activity we're dealing in at this point. There are contending forces out in the lobby. How can you get something on the ballot, even if it's confusing to the public,...
