SENATOR BOURNE: Well, I would say that...because it says, where the municipality is located, and I assume at this current time the fair is located in Lincoln,...

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...so I would say that Lincoln would have to provide a match to the fair of at least 10 percent of what they receive from the reallocation.

SENATOR LANDIS: Yeah. The local effort here...in fact, I've got colleagues on the floor who are urging to me to have a county lodging tax increase. If there is a city of Lincoln and if there is a county of Lancaster contribution equal to 10 percent, is that sufficient for a match from your (inaudible)?

SENATOR BOURNE: Well, that's not how...that is not how it is drafted.

SENATOR LANDIS: I agree. I'm trying...

SENATOR BOURNE: You're asking my philos...

SENATOR LANDIS: ...to get to an idea here. I think you're saying, look, we should see some local effort, some reasonable local effort.

SENATOR BOURNE: Exactly.

SENATOR LANDIS: And I think that in this context, local effort is...it's fair to say, just the city of Lincoln, but also Lancaster County, particularly since there's, you know, a lodging tax situation there, and we will have lodgers, that we should be able to rely on both. And I'm asking if in fact those two entities would be able to be constituted a reasonable local contribution.

SENATOR BOURNE: That is a very fair question. Again, as it's drafted, it says municipality. I...you know, going back again to the sewer separation thing, I think, that we did in 2001,
