SENATOR LANDIS: ...and the county sources. Seems to me to be a legitimate idea. I wouldn't say no to that. I do think, by the way, that if I did that, it seems to me that that should bridge the gap here. And my guess is it should mean that you should be able to support the bill. In which case, if that's the case, I'd be happy to consider the idea you're putting here, if what we're talking about is finding a 10 percent local match of a reasonable nature to show local commitment and contribution to the effort, because that's fair. I'll do that.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Landis and Senator Bourne. Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. You know, this is interesting. As most of you know, I support the proposal for the fair, and I have ever since it came up. But it's kind of interesting, now we're talking about sharing. And I guess my only concern is, if we're going to do this for...we've done this for Omaha and we're going to do this for Lincoln, what about Beatrice and Grand Island? If they decide they want to come in and we start to share with them on these kind of propositions, I don't know why they wouldn't want to come in and say, well, we'll put up a certain amount of money, and you provide the rest of it, and we'll do the things for the infrastructure that we want to do. You know, those are the kind of things that we're starting to get ourself into. As all of you know, I opposed vehemently the proposal that came up that gave the money to Omaha and to Lincoln. I still think I was right. Senator Chambers rode with it because he was getting something that he wanted in his part of Omaha. And I can't fault that. That's the way the game is played. My concern is, are we going to then start to reach out to other communities and say, well, we'll take some of the money for this proposition because it's state money and we'll divide it, you match it, and here we'll be? Now, how are you going to respond to that proposal when...I'm sure that people like Senator Byars is going to step up and say, you know, we got a problem down here needs to be addressed; let's look at it. Well, I think (inaudible) put up 10 percent of the money, and you provide the rest of it. So I want to support this proposal to get some money for the State Fair, because I think it's important. And I know some of
