But there's still an issue out there that needs to be talked a little bit about before we embark on this kind of a venture and get ourselves painted into this corner, which is maybe exactly what happens. With that, Mr. Speaker, I'll return the rest of my time back to the Chair, and be willing to listen to other people's thoughts. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Beutler. I'm sorry, Senator Beutler. Due to a malfunction, Senator Louden is next.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. Senator Bourne I think has probably a good idea, that whoever hosts the State Fair should probably be putting up some of their local money, should sponsor it. Fairs mostly all over the state and everyplace are always sponsored by local people. And where the city of Lincoln probably receives a great deal of monetary money and effort from the State Fair, I think they should probably be finding some sponsors. However, I don't know as that should be into the...set in law that they have to receive it, or should be put in the constitution that if any city receives any money transferred out of there, why, that it should be...they'd have to match it. We don't know if this State Fair is going to stay in Lincoln forever or not. I'm willing to give them the chance, or the benefit of the doubt for a few years. I think that it should stand on its own. I think that the city should take care of it. I'm certainly in favor of giving them a chance, and if they can't make the thing work, then I think it probably should be...should go west. And I'm sure enough of you know when I say west, what we mean by west. I kind of liked that amendment wording that Senator Landis had in his amendment. I think Senator Chambers asked what some of that related transfers meant. And as far as Senator Chambers, I think what that related means, I think that means that it's something transferred from West Virginia, because they tell me everything in West Virginia is relative.
