Yet we're being asked to adopt these provisions, make them a part of the constitution, if the public votes to do so after we present such a hodgepodge and a mishmash to them. SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. There's an undeniable worth there that we certainly don't want to give up. But you know, it's interesting, because we hear about the fair dying, and it's dead, and it's buried, and all these other things, and it's interesting to me, because we look at fairs like Iowa, that are growing every year. Why? Because they've got money to do the things you need to make a fair interesting and valuable to the people that it represents. We don't have that kind of money, but we could put something into this fair. And I said from day one, when we...when the fair was reorganized and we had leadership, we had new board members who have shown a great deal of interest in the future of the fair, we have a manager who has a vision, and that's what it takes in this world today is a vision to make things work. I often think about businesses. And all of you know of businesses that have failed, completely failed, and somebody came along with a new vision, and all of a sudden the business prospered. Same way with the fair. The right management, the right kind of people in charge of the fair, can make it again what it was years ago when it was a valuable institution in this state, and that can be
